1. GETTING STARTED

This *User Manual* will help you to familiarize yourself with the **9-Hole Stroke Play** application. The dialog boxes and controls in this *User Manual* may appear different from the dialog boxes and controls that appear on your computer screen.

Stroke play, also known as medal play, is a form of competition based on the cumulative number of strokes taken, either over one round or several. This application is for 9-hole rounds. The user selects either front nine or back nine.

The **9-Hole Stroke Play** application is used to set up and run 9-hole stroke play events, including and not limited to:

- Individual (up to 15 flights) low gross and low net.
- Callaway handicapping for 9 holes.
- Individual Stableford (up to 15 flights) (gross, net and quota).
- Team Stableford (up to 15 flights) (gross, net and quota).
- Select skins game for all of above.
- Select players playing skins.

This User Manual describes all the steps necessary to complete a 9-hole stroke play event.

Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the text conventions, terms, and controls used in this *User Manual*.

1.1 Text Conventions

The examples below explain the specially formatted text used in this *User Manual*.

- Dialog boxes and control names appear in bold type: Select Member dialog
- Keyboard key names appear in bold type: Home, End, Backspace, Tab
- Keyboard keys that must be pressed at the same time to perform a task appear in bold type with a plus (+) between the key names: Alt+H
- Drives appear as capital letters: drive C
- File names appear in italics with an initial capital letter: Setup.exe
- Command line statements appear in lower case bold type: a:\install
- Names of icons appear in bold type: My Computer icon
- Menu items, option buttons, and check boxes appear in bold type: Programs, Accessories,
 Tournament option, Use 18-Hole Factor check box

1.2 Terms

You can use either a single-button mouse or a multiple-button mouse with this application.

If you have a multiple-button mouse, the left mouse button is the primary mouse button, unless you have configured it differently. Any procedure that requires you to click the secondary button will refer to it as "the right mouse button."

If you have a single-button mouse, pressing the **Ctrl** key while clicking the mouse button is the same as clicking the right mouse button.

This User Manual uses the following terms.

Term	Meaning
9-Hole Stroke Play	Name of application.
Press	Strike a key from the keyboard.

menu bar or dropdown menu.

Select Click a command button. Click an item from a

menu bar or dropdown menu. Click an option button to make a black dot appear. Click a check box to make an **X** appear. Click and item in a list box, then click **OK**, or double click

and item in a list.

Clear Click an option button to make the black dot

disappear. Click a check box to make the X

disappear.


In Windows, the terms *choose* and *select* have different and specific meanings. Selecting an item usually means mark it with the selection cursor, which can appear as a highlight, a dotted rectangle, or both. You also select *check boxes* and *option buttons* in dialogs. Selecting alone does not initiate an action.

You choose an item to carry out an action. For example, choosing a command button or menu item might open a dialog or carry out a command. You often need to select an item before you can choose it.

1.3 Controls

You can use a combination of mouse and keyboard techniques. For example, you could click an item to select it, and then press **Enter** from the keyboard to choose it. When a procedure in this *User Manual* says to choose an item, generally you can use whichever method you prefer.

This section gives basic information about controls and their functions. Throughout this *Guide*, the control name will be in bold type. For example, select **OK** or select **Courses Table** check box. The controls found in the **9-Hole Stroke Play** application are similar as shown below.





1.3.1 Button or Command Button

You choose a *command button* to initiate an action, such as carrying out or cancelling a command. Common command buttons are **OK** and **Cancel**. They are often located along the bottom or on the right side of the dialog.

A command button, followed by an ellipsis (...) or a double greater-than sign (>>) opens another dialog box.

Unavailable command buttons are dimmed. The currently selected button has a darker border than other buttons. You can choose the currently selected button, simply by pressing the **Enter** key.

To choose a command button, click the command button. Or press the **Tab** key until the button you want is selected, and then press the **Enter** key.

1.3.2 Text Box

You type information into a *text box*. When you move to an empty text box, an *insertion point* (a flashing vertical bar) appears. The text you type starts at the insertion point.

If the box you move to already contains text, and the text is highlighted, any text you type replaces it. You can also delete the existing text by pressing the **Delete** key or **Backspace** key.

To select text in a text box, drag the pointer across the text, or double-click a word to select one word at a time. Or press and hold down the **Shift** key while pressing an **Arrow** key.

1.3.3 Combo Box

A *combo box* appears initially as a rectangular box containing the current selection. When you select the down arrow in the square box at the right, a list of available choices appears. If there are more items than can fit in the box, scroll bars are provided.

To open a combo box and select an item:

- 1. Click the arrow at the right to see a list of available choices.
- Click the up or down scroll arrow, if visible or drag the scroll box to move to the item you want to select.
- 3. Click the item.

1.3.4 Option Button

Option buttons represent a group of mutually exclusive options. You can select only one option at a time. If you already have one option selected, your current selection replaces it. The option buttons are, generally enclosed in a frame. The selected option button contains a black dot. Names of unavailable options are dimmed.

To select an option button, click the option button.

1.3.5 Check Box

A *check box* means you can select or clear an option. You can select as many check-box options as needed. When a check box is selected, it contains an **X**. Names of unavailable options are dimmed. To select or clear check boxes, click the check box.

1.3.6 Spin Control

The *spin control* is a control that works with another control, such as a text box to increment and decrement values. It can also, scroll back and forth through a range of values or a list of items.

To continue to increment the value, click the up (or right) arrow of the spin control and hold down the



mouse button, then release the mouse button when the desired value is displayed. Likewise, repeat the latter by clicking the down (or left) arrow to decrement the value. If a flashing vertical bar appears when you drag the mouse cursor over the area left of the up (or right) and down (or left) arrows, the control contains a text box. If the area is highlighted or selected you can change the value or list with the up and down (or left and right) arrow keys from the keyboard.

1.3.7 Menu Bar

The *menu bar* contains a list of menu items. Some commands carry out an action immediately; others display a dialog so that you can select options, or a dropdown menu. Dimmed menu items are unavailable.

A menu item followed by an ellipsis (...) opens another dialog.

1.3.8 Frame

A frame groups the controls together. The name of the frame usually describes the group of controls.

1.3.9 Icon

Icons are small pictures that represent something. For example, the icon in the previous illustration represents a male. Some icons act as a command button.

1.3.10 List Box

A *list box* displays a list of choices. If there are more choices than can fit in the box, scroll bars are provided so you can move quickly through the list. Some list boxes are accompanied with a text box. If you type a letter in the text box the list box scrolls to match the letter you type.

Usually, you can select only one item in a list box. There are some cases when you can select more than one item.

To select a single item from a list box:

- Use the method as described above or
- Click the scroll arrows until the item you want to select appears in the list
- Click the item, and then choose the appropriate command button or double-click the item to select it and complete the command all in one step.

To select multiple sequential items in a list, click the first item you want to select, and then drag the cursor to the last item you want to select.

To cancel the selection, click any item in the list or click the first item you want to select, press and hold down the **Shift** key, and click the last item you want to select. Both items, and all items in between, are selected.

To select multiple non-sequential items in a list, press and hold down the **Ctrl** key, and click each item you want to select.

To cancel a selection, press and hold down the **Ctrl** key, and click the item again.

1.4 System Requirements

The application will operate on the following operating systems and configurations:

- PC with a 266 MHz or greater Pentium-class processor
- Microsoft Windows 95/98/2000/ME/XP/Vista
- 256 MB of RAM or greater
- 15 MB available hard drive space
- CD drive

2. INSTALLATION AND SETUP

The application must be installed to a hard disk, before it can run. Please look at the appropriate instructions below.

2.1 Installing from Website

To install application from Golfsoft Software website:

- 1. Logon to the Golfsoft Software website (www.golfsoftsoftware.ca).
- 2. Click the 9-Hole Stroke Play hyperlink.
- 3. Click the **Download Application** hyperlink and save to your desktop.
- 4. When the download is complete and successful, logoff from the website.
- 5. Double-click the Stroke9Setup icon from your desktop.
- 6. Delete the Stroke9Setup icon from your desktop.

2.2 Installing from CD-ROM

To install application from CD-ROM:

- 1. Turn on your computer and start Microsoft Windows 95/98/2000/ME/XP/Vista.
- 2. Place the application CD in your CD-ROM drive.
- 3. If AutoPlay is enabled, the installation will begin once the drive closes, follow the on-screen instructions.

Or

If Auto Play is not enabled, you will need to manually install the application. Double-click the **My Computer** icon on your desktop, double-click the icon for your CD-ROM drive, and then double-click the **Stroke9Setup.exe** icon. Once the installation begins follow the on-screen instructions.

2.3 Uninstalling Application

To uninstall application:

- 1. Turn on your computer and start Microsoft Windows 95/98/NT4/2000/ME/XP/Vista.
- 2. Click the Start button on the taskbar, point to Settings, and then click Control Panel.
- 3. Double-click **Add or Remove Programs**, select **Golfsoft Software 9-Hole Stroke Play**, and then click **Add/Remove** to uninstall the application.



2.4 Using Application

2.4.1 Starting Application

To start 9-Hole Stoke Play application from the Start Menu, click the Start button on the task bar, point to Programs, then Golfsoft Software, and then select 9-Hole Stroke Play to launch the application.

To start 9-Hole Stoke Play application from the Handicap Manager 2011, click the 9-Hole Stoke Play button.

To start **9-Hole Stoke Play** application from the **desktop**, double-click the **9-Hole Stoke Play** application icon on your desktop.

2.4.2 Start Up

Once the application is started, a **Start Up** window will appear.



2.4.3 Command Buttons

2.4.3.1 System Manager Access

Click the **System Manager Access** button to obtain access to the main **9-Hole Stroke Play** application. If the application is password protected, type in the System Manager password and click the **OK** button.

2.4.3.2 Sign Up

This command button allows members to sign up their name and other players to the 9-hole stroke play competition, which has been previously setup by the System Manager. The response to this button will require the member to enter his/her access code.

To sign up to the competition, click the **Sign Up** button and enter a valid access code. These actions will open the **Tee Times** dialog.

When the **Tee Times** dialog opens, the **Current Mode** will be *Sign Up* mode (Follow the instructions in Section 4.6.4). Click **Exit** from the menu bar, to close the dialog.



2.4.3.3 Remove

This command button allows members to remove their name and players that they signed up. The response to this button will require the member to enter his/her access code.

To remove names from the competition, click the **Remove** button and enter a valid access code. These actions will open the **Tee Times** dialog.

When the **Tee Times** dialog opens, the **Current Mode** will be *Delete* mode (Follow the instructions in Section 4.6.9). Click **Exit** from the menu bar, to close the dialog.

2.4.3.4 Print Scorecards

This command button allows members to print their scorecard and for players that they signed up. The response to this button will require the member to enter his/her access code.

To print scorecard(s), click the **Print Scorecards** button and enter a valid access code. These actions will open the **Print Scorecards...** dialog.



- 1. Select players from the list on the left:
 - Double-click players name,
 - Click players name and click the >> button or
 - Click the All >> button to select all players.
- 2. Click the Print button.



2.4.3.5 Add Scores

This command button allows members to add their score and for players that they signed up. The response to this button will require the member to enter his/her access code.

To add score(s), click the **Add Scores** button and enter a valid access code. These actions will open the **Add Scores...** dialog.



- 1. Select players from the list on the left:
 - Double-click players name,
 - Click players name and click the >> button or
 - Click the All >> button to select all players.
- 2. Click the Add button.
- 3. Enter each player's hole-by-hole score and click the **Enter** button (See Section 3.6.1.2 for instructions).

2.4.3.6 Cancel

Click the Cancel button or press the Esc key from the keyboard to exit the Start Up window.



3. MENU ITEMS

File Courses... Members... Non Members... Sign Up... Scores... Zip UnZip Print Help

The *menu bar* contains a list of menu items. Some commands carry out an action immediately; others display a dialog so that you can select options, or a dropdown menu. Dimmed menu items are unavailable.

A menu item followed by an ellipsis (...) opens another dialog.

To access any of the menu items, click the item or press the **Alt** key from the keyboard and at the same time press the underscored letter of the menu item. Some of the menu items have dropdown menu items.

3.1 File

The **File** menu item offers commands to 6 dropdown menus:



3.1.1 New

To create a new event, click **File|New...** from the menu bar. This opens a **New Event** dialog, which displays the default options of the 9-hole stroke play event. Set or select the options, as required.




Name of Event – This text box allows the user to enter the name of the event or competition. The text that you enter here should describe the event (e.g. Monday Men's Night).



Stableford – This check box selects the competition format as Stableford stroke play. This option will determine the availability of some menus and options. If the **Handicap** option is selected to *Gross, Net or Callaway* format, this check box will be disabled. *Gross & Net* or *Net & Gross* format must be selected to enable this check box.

Stableford scoring systems are stroke-play formats in which the high total wins, not the low. That is because in Stableford, your final score is not your stroke total, but rather the total points you have earned for your scores on each individual hole.

Date – This is the date of the event. Click the Calendar button, to select the date.



Handicap – This combo box allows users to select one of five options: *Gross, Net, Gross & Net, Net & Gross* or *Callaway* format.

Allowance – This combo box allows users to select one of four options: 100%, 95%, 90% or 80%. This control is not available, if the **Handicap** option is set to: *Gross*.

Round Type - This combo box allows users to select one of two options: Front Nine or Back Nine.

Skins – This check box enables skins and allows the user to set skins options.

- Handicap This combo box allows users to select one of two options: Gross or Net.
- **Allowance** This combo box allows users to select one of four options: 100%, 95%, 90% or 80%. This control is not available, if the **Handicap** option is set to: *Gross*.
- Entry Fee This combo box allows users to enter the entry fee for the skins competition.

Type of Stroke Play – These options allows users to select the type of stroke play.

Entry Fee


- Member This text box allows users to enter the entry fee for members.
- Non-Member This text box allows users to enter the entry fee for non-members.
- Pay This text box allows users to enter the collector of the entry fee for the competition or where to pay the entry fee.
- **Total Collected** This box displays the total amount of money collected for the competition.

Click Add button when finished.



3.1.2 Open

To open an event that has been previously created, click **File|Open...** from the menu bar. Select the event from the list and click the **Open** button.



3.1.3 Close

To close an opened event and return to the main screen, click File|Close from the menu bar.

3.1.4 Delete

To delete an event from the database, click **File|Delete...**from the menu bar. Select the event from the list and click the **Delete** button.

3.1.5 Print Setup

To set the properties of the default printer, click File|Print Setup from the menu bar.

3.1.6 Exit

To exit the application, click **File|Exit** from the menu bar.



3.2 Courses...

To execute the Courses Management application (COURSES.EXE), click **Courses...** from the menu bar. See the <u>Courses Management User Manual</u> for instructions.

3.3 Members...

To execute the Members Management application (MEMBERS.EXE), click **Members...** from the menu bar.

See the <u>Members Management User Manual</u> for instructions.

3.4 Non-Members...


To execute the Non-Members Management application (NONMEMS.EXE), click **Non-Members...** from the menu bar.

See the Non-Members Management User Manual for instructions.



3.5 Sign Up...

To access the Sign Up Players dialog, click Sign Up... from the menu bar.



Note: To sign up players directly to tee times, sign up players through the **Tee Times** command button option, as described in Section 4.6.4.

To sign up players, select names from the list on the left.

To remove a player, click the name from the list on the right.

Ask for 18-Hole Handicap Factor – This check box selects the option of prompting the user to enter a manual Handicap Factor.

No Factor Calc. Maximum Handicap – This check box selects the method for calculating the player's Handicap, if the player has no Handicap Factor. If checked, the player's Handicap will be calculated from the maximum Handicap Factor allowed for the gender of the player. If not checked, the Handicap will be zero or scratch.


Update Handicap Factors – This command button updates Handicap Factors and recalculates Handicaps for each player in the member's database.

New – This command button allows users to add a new player to the non-members database. If the **Members Only** option has been selected, this button will be disabled.



3.6 Scores...

To access the **Scores** dialog, click **Scores...** from the menu bar. The **Scores** dialog display will vary depending on what options have been chosen. The text of the dropdown menu items will also vary. Depending on what options have been chosen previously, some menu items will be disabled.



This dialog allows users to:

- Add, edit and view player scores.
- Select first place play-off winners.
- Toggle between viewing skins only and hole-by-hole total scores.
- View Handicaps or Handicap Factors.
- Print skins results.
- Print net, gross, net & gross, gross & net and Callaway scores.
- Print Stableford points to the default printer.
- Print scorecards.



3.6.1 Menu Items

Exit Add Edit Delete View Skins Print Export

3.6.1.1 Exit

To exit the **Scores** dialog, click **Exit** from the menu bar.

3.6.1.2 Add

The **Add** menu item offers commands to 2 dropdown menus.




To add players:

- 1. Click Add|Players... from the menu bar.
- 2. Select players from the list and click the **Add** button.

To add player's round:

 Click Add|Round... from the menu bar or press F5 key from keyboard.

Select player from the list and click the **Add Round** button. Players will not appear in the list, if their round has been added.



3. Type the hole-by-hole scores and click the **Enter** button. The flashing arrow indicates the hole-score to enter.

Add 18 Hole Round – This command button allows you to enter an 18-hole round.

If no scores are available, you can select any of the 4 check boxes: Did Not Show, Did Not Finish, Disqualified and/or Did Not return Scorecard.



3.6.1.3 Edit

The **Edit** menu item offers commands to 4 dropdown menus.



To edit player's round:

1. Click Edit|Round... from the menu bar

or

press **F6** key from the keyboard.

Select player from list and click the Edit Round button.

Players will not appear in the list, if their round has not been added.

Edit hole-by-hole scores of the selected player and click the OK button.
 To move the flashing arrow, click the Hole Number area above the hole-score that you want to change.

To edit player's Handicap:

- 1. Click Edit|Handicap... from the menu bar
- 2. Select player from list and click the Edit Hcp button.
- 3. Enter new Handicap and click the **OK** button.

To edit player's Handicap Factor:


- 1. Click **Edit|Handicap Factor...** from the menu bar
- 2. Select player from list and click the **Edit HF** button.
- 3. Enter new Handicap Factor and click the **OK** button.

To edit or select the playoff winner:

- 1. Click Edit|Playoff Winner... from the menu bar.
- 2. Select playoff winner from the list and click the **Winner** button or click **Reset** button to reset playoff winner selection.

3.6.1.4 Delete

The **Delete** menu item offers commands to 2 dropdown menus.



To delete players:

- 1. Click **Delete|Players...** from the menu bar.
- 2. Select players from the list and click the **Delete** button.


To delete players without scores:

1. Click **Delete|Players with No Scores...** from the menu bar.



3.6.1.5 View

The **View** menu item offers commands to 13 dropdown menus. The menu items will vary depending on what options have been chosen. The text of the dropdown menu items will also vary. Depending on what options have been chosen previously, some menu items will be disabled.



If the 9-hole stroke play competition is broken into flights, click **View|Flight** $\triangleright |\underline{x}|$ **Flight** (\underline{y} to \underline{x}) from the menu bar. Where, x is the flight letter (A to O), y and x is the Handicap range.

To view gross scores, click View|Gross Scores from the menu bar.

To view net scores, click View|Net Scores from the menu bar.

To view Callaway scores, click View|Callaway Scores from the menu bar.

To view Equitable Stroke Control scores, click View|Equitable Stroke Control from the menu bar.

To view skins only, click **View|Skins Only** \triangleright |x Flight (y to x) from the menu bar. Where, x is the flight letter (A to O), y and x is the handicap range.

To view Handicap Factors, click View|Factors from the menu bar.

To view 18-hole Handicaps, click View 18-Hole Handicaps from the menu bar.

To view 9-Hole Handicaps, click **View|9-Hole Handicaps** from the menu bar.

To hide scores, click View|Hide Scores from menu bar and show scores, click View|Show Scores.

To view a range of handicaps, click **View|Range** from the menu bar. Select the range and click **OK** button.

4. COMMAND BUTTONS

A command button, followed by an ellipsis (...) or a double greater-than sign (>>) opens another dialog box.

Unavailable command buttons are dimmed. The currently selected button has a darker border than other buttons. You can choose the currently selected button, simply by pressing the **Enter** key.

To choose a command button, click the command button. Or press the **Tab** key until the button you want is selected, and then press the **Enter** key.

After you start a new event or open an old event, the screen will display several command buttons:



Simply, click the appropriate command button.

4.1 Event

This command button opens the **Old Event** dialog, which allows users to edit changes to parameters that were set during create new event procedure (See Section 3.1.1).



4.2 Signup Sheet

This command button opens the **Signup Sheet** dialog, which allows users to determine who can play in the competition.



Members Only – This check box determines if non-members can play in the competition.


Status – Select one or multiple options.

Gender – Select one of three options.

• Click the **OK** button, to accept changes.

4.3 Courses

This command button opens the **Courses** dialog, which allows users to modify the current course information, such as: yardage, par or handicap. This dialog also allows users to select the tees of the home course or select an away course and the tees.




Home Course – Click this command button to select the tees of the home course.

Away Course - Click this command button to select an away course and the tees.

Modify Course – Click this command button to modify the details of the selected course, such as: yardage, par, and Handicap stroke holes.

4.3.1 Modify Course








List of Courses – This combo box allows the user to select an away course from the COURSES database. If the ID number of the course is known, the away course may be select with the **Search by** button. Click the **Search by** button and enter the ID number in the appearing text box.

To select the tees, click the appropriate button displaying the color of the tees or type the number that is displayed on the button.

4.4 Flights

This command button opens the **Select Flights** window and allows the user to set flights of the competition. Up to 15 flights may be selected. The dialog also displays the number of players in each flight and the players in the competition. Initial start up of this dialog, during a new event setup, the number of flights is usually zero and the flight boxes are not visible.



Flights – This scroll control allows the user to set the number of flights. As you increase or decrease the number of flights, flight details are made visible or not visible, respectively.

Set Min / Max – Click this command button to fill in all the fields displaying the flight ranges. The first flight will display the minimum Handicap and last flight will contain the maximum Handicap.

Flight Spin Controls – Click the up arrow of the appropriate spin control and hold down the mouse button, then release the mouse button when the desired Handicap range is displayed. Likewise, repeat the latter by clicking the down arrow of the appropriate spin control to decrement the desired Handicap range.


Manual Maximum Handicap – Select this check box to use a manual maximum Handicap. After selecting this option, select the manual maximum Handicap with the spin control and click the **Set Min / Max** button.

Use 18-Hole Factor – Select this check box to use 18-hole Handicap Factor of players to calculate their 9-hole Handicap.

• Click the **OK** button, to accept changes.

4.5 Stableford

This command button opens the **Stableford Points** window and allows the user to change or set up the Stableford points for: hole-in-one, double eagle, eagle, birdie, par, bogey, double bogey, and triple bogey. The dialog also allows the user to set the format and percent handicap allowance.



To set the points, click the appropriate **Up** and **Down** scroll arrows.

Format – This combo box allows the user to select one of three format options: Gross, Net or Quota.

Allowance – This combo box allows the user to select one of four percentages options: 100%, 95%, 90% or 80%. This option is used by the application to calculate Handicaps and Handicap Factors. This option is not available, if Gross or Quota format option has been selected.

If Quota option is selected, players start with half their 18-hole Handicap. For example, a player with an 18-hole Handicap of 17 would start with 8.5 points.

Click the **OK** button, to accept changes.

4.6 Tee Times

This command button opens the **Tee Times** dialog, which allows the user to:

- Setup the draw.
- Signup players.
- Check in players (paid).
- Add players that have been signup with another method.
- Edit Handicap Factors.
- Replace or switch players.
- Replace or switch starting tees.
- Delete players from the tee sheet only or from the competition.
- Print signup sheets and tee times.




4.6.1 Exit

To exit the **Tee Times** dialog, click **Exit** from the menu bar.

4.6.2 Setup Draw...

To open the **Tee Times Setup** dialog, click **Setup Draw...** from the menu bar. Before opening **Tee Times** Setup window, select the appropriate tab: Morning, Afternoon or Evening.



After selecting options and setting parameters, click the **OK** button to accept.

Date – This box displays the date of the 9-hole stroke play competition.

Start Time – This display area is used to set the starting tee time or first tee time. The **Hour** spin control is for setting the hour and the **Minute** spin control is for setting the minutes.

Interval – This display area is used to set the time interval (in minutes) between tee times. If the **Shotgun** check box is selected, the spin control is disabled.

Shotgun – This check box sets the event to a shotgun start, otherwise tee times.

Type of Course – These options set the type of course and how many holes are displayed in the **Starting Groups Per Tee** frame.

Players – This text box sets the maximum number of players that can play in the event. Use the spin control to the right to increase or decrease this number.

Groups – This box displays the number of groups.

Group Size – These options set the group size.

Starting Groups Per Tee – These spin controls allow you to set the number of groups that start on each hole during a shotgun start. If the **Shotgun** check box is not selected, this frame will not be visible.

4.6.3 View

The View menu item offers commands to 3 dropdown menus.



Click the appropriate dropdown menu item to view Players, Teams or Handicap Factors.

4.6.4 Sign Up

To set the **Current Mode** in *Sign Up* mode, click **Sign Up** from the menu bar. The *Sign Up* mode allows users to sign up players to tee times and scorecard. While in *Sign Up* mode, available tee times are displayed in yellow background.



To enter a player's Handicap Factor manually, select the **Ask for Handicap Factor** check box; otherwise the application will extract the current Handicap Factor of the player from the member's database. Handicap Factors for Non-Members must be entered manually.

To sign up multiple players using the display above:

- 1. Click the >>> box.
- 2. Select each player from the list and click the **OK** button.
- 3. If the **Ask for Handicap Factor** check box is selected, enter the player's Handicap Factor and click the **OK** button.

To sign up a single player:

- 1. Click one of the yellow boxes.
- 2. Select player from the list and click the **OK** button.
- 3. If the **Ask for Handicap Factor** check box is selected, enter the player's Handicap Factor and click the **OK** button.

To turn off Sign Up mode, click **Done** from the menu bar.

4.6.5 Check In

To set the **Current Mode** in *Check In.*.. mode, click **Check In** from the menu bar. The *Check In* mode allows users to select or unselect players that paid their entry fee to the competition. Paid players are displayed in yellow background and unpaid players are displayed in white background.



Click the appropriate box to select or unselect paid players.

When the player is checked in and not on the scorecard, that player will be added to the scorecard.

To turn off Check In mode, click **Done** from the menu bar.

4.6.6 Add

To set the **Current Mode** in *Add* mode, click **Add** from the menu bar. The *Add* mode allows users to sign up players to tee times. While in *Add* mode, available tee times are displayed in yellow background. *Add* mode is similar to *Signup* mode, except:

- The selection list is limited to players that were signup using the **Signup...** menu item.
- Players are not added to the scorecard.
 To add players to scorecard you must use the Check In option, described in Section 4.6.4 or add the player via the Scores dialog, described in Section 3.6.1.2.

To turn off Add mode, click **Done** from the menu bar.

4.6.7 Edit

To set the Current Mode in Edit mode, click Edit from the menu bar. The Edit mode allows users to:

- Perform random draw of starting holes for shotgun start tee times.
- Clear tee times display.
- Edit starting holes and tee times.
- Load players from signup sheet.
- Import players from **Tee Time** application.
- Update and adjust Handicap Factors.



To perform a random draw of starting holes for shotgun start tee times, click the **Draw Tees** button once or several times.

To clear the tee times display, click the Clear button.

To edit starting hole, click the tee name that you want to change in the **Tee** column and enter the new starting hole or tee name.

To edit tee time:

1. Click the tee time that you want to change in the **Time** column.



The **Hour** spin control is for setting the hour and the **Minute** spin control is for setting the minutes.

- 2. Adjust the Hour and Minute spin control.
- 3. Select Morning, Afternoon or Evening option.
- 4. Click the **OK** button.

To update Handicap Factors and recalculate Handicaps:

- 1. Click the **Update Handicap Factors** button.
- 2. To update Handicap Factors and recalculate Handicaps automatically from the member's database, click the **Yes** button; otherwise click the **No** button.
 - The dialog is now in **Update Handicap Factors** mode.
- 3. To edit a player's Handicap Factor, click the box containing the player's name and enter their Handicap Factor, and then click the **OK** button or press **Enter** from the keyboard. The application will recalculate the player's Handicap.

To set or edit starting tees:

To turn off Replace mode, click **Done** from the menu bar.
